Session 2 'The Site Visit' Supporting Notes

Risks

The follwing risks have been identified foir considersation

- The activities lead the pupils away from the main paths of the church, the ground around the site is uneven.
- There are Yew trees in the church yard the berries are known to be poisonous, there may also be other toxic species of plant.
- There is only one W/C available on site.
- The site is generally accessible by the main route, however there is a none compliant temporary ramp inside the main church door. Certain users may require support here.
- The floor surface within the church is uneven in places.
- There is loose free-standing furniture around the church.
- The church us open so other visitors may be present.

Please remember the pupils are in a church setting, remind them to be calm and respectful. There may be mourning families visiting graves etc.

The session

There will be a brief introduction lead by a member of Scampton church or the CWGC. This will serve as a welcome and encourage reflection on session 1, delivered in school.

Following this we would ask teachers to undertake the following.

- 1. Divide the children into groups of 2 or 3, ideally with mixed abilities.
- 2. Provide each group with the name of a 'Fallen Friend' to investigate, there is space for them to write the name in the activity sheet with the gravestone image on.
- 3. The groups should not all start the same activity to begin with or the information screens will be in demand by everyone at the same time. There are 3 key activities
 - The research of your 'Fallen Friend' there are three sheets for this activity Your Fallen Friends War Grave, Your Fallen Friends Story, and Your Fallen Friends War Story.
 - The 'Inside the Church' Worksheet.
 - The 'Nature' Worksheet.


There is also a worksheet called 'Time' for those who finish their tasks early or have waiting time for the digital screens.

Inside the Church

- Maximus Mouse's front door is on the side of the organ.
- The Seat displaying the flowers of the 4 nations is up 2 steps towards the alter on the left.
- The yellow converging beams of yellow fused glass below the insignia on the stained-glass window represent the two floodlights beneath the Lancasters during Operation Chastise. The crushed fused glass beneath the floodlights represents the water.
- Seven silhouettes of Lancasters appear in the upper reaches of the window. The four in dark colour represent those crews who did not return from Operation Chastise
